#### **Letter from the Headmaster**

Dear Parents and Carers,

As our first 'full' week concludes, I have been pondering stamina, resolve and new experiences. Your children, across the board and in all of our settings on the St Petroc's site, have astounded me. The air of calmness, focus and - most importantly - smiling faces has been evident within every room. I have seen the 'chaos' of trying to get back into routines and drop children to their respective classes, year groups, new teachers, Early Years settings and, often, all of those have involved some form of new location. All of which can be incredibly unsettling. Yet, almost without breaking stride, I am so impressed with how your children cope with the demands of being with us for jampacked full days from the word 'go'.

The new Reception children looked as bright and as energetic this morning as they did last Wednesday. Yet, often without meaning to, people discount or discredit children of their age of being able to 'do' so many wonderful things, let alone starting school full time and for the first time. I listed the highlights to everyone in our assembly this morning and it is invigorating to know that our 4 and 5 year olds are already experiencing so much of what the school has to offer. The swimming pool looked superb with so many of our children taking part in lessons on Tuesday morning and I was very impressed with how able and independent they are. There are certainly signs that the activities that take place in the Dolphins preschool are paying real dividends in their development when they start school. (I am sure they will be tired this weekend though!)

Other highlights included the start of our activities programme for the older children. The photos on Facebook show some fantastic towers constructed by the 'Beach Rangers' and I know the staff were hopeful of some extras from the Cookery Club but to no avail.... The Year 2 golfers had a blast with the coach from Bude Golf Club, although they were slightly 'competitive' at times, following on from their Tennis sessions last term. Then our week moved onto STEMFest 2019, when the children from Years 1 to 6 travelled to the National Marine Aquarium in Plymouth, to learn about how they are going to build their very own boat, in partnership with Princess Yachts, and sail it on the Plymouth Sound in March. They also managed to manufacture and engrave their own souvenir, before shoe-horning in a tour with an educational talk that involved multiple virtual reality headsets about the wildlife in our oceans. All in all, just another normal but very inspiring week at St Petroc's.

#### Years 1 & 2



#### Incredible individuals

Years 1 and 2 have been working extremely hard this week. We combined our PSHE with our English lesson and were thinking of all the adjectives we could use to describe each of us individually. The children had some great ideas and the end results were incredible, so we've put them on display for all to see! The class have also started learning to play recorders! After last week's start on composition, they combined the two skills by using their new instruments to play their own work.





#### Years 3 & 4

#### **New routines**

The Year 3 and 4 children have settled into the routines of Key Stage 2 with enthusiasm and hard work. They have been working on number bonds to 100 and 1000 respectively, and also ordering numbers on number lines. In English, they have been reading 'Stone Age Boy' and have written a postcard from the Stone Age using fronted adverbials.





#### Year 5



# Reading between the lines

We've dived straight back into our work in Year 5. We've started our topic on poetry, in particular ballads, and have been using our inference and deduction to try and comprehend what is 'really' happening. The cliff hangers provide for great discussion! In Maths, we have begun with place value; adding, subtracting, ordering and investigating palindromic numbers. The class have also taken time to create their 'Celebrity Profiles', which contain kind words and thoughts from all of those in the class. A class agreement was also discussed, written and signed by all pupils. A busy and happy start to the term! Year 5 have settled into their roles as Juniors fantastically.





#### Year 6

#### Firm foundations

Year 6 have started the new academic year strongly, cracking on with their new duties and diving straight in with their learning. This week in Maths, they have explored the many reasons it's necessary to know the place value, from column addition and subtraction with 6 digit numbers, to comparing decimal numbers and multiplying and dividing them by 10, 100 and 1,000.





English has focused on three different areas so far. The class are becoming familiar with investigative stories through their reading and, this week, were introduced to their new class novels and guided reading texts. They have been creating and self-assessing recounts, writing two pieces recalling their summer holidays and the wonderful experiences they had at Plymouth Aquarium's STEM day on Thursday. Finally, suffixes have been the focus of SPAG, revisiting the spelling rules involved when adding endings to words.

There have also been a lot introductions to new, fresh topics in the foundations subjects, which are already causing much excitement and anticipation amongst the pupils.

#### An explosive time in Stay and Play!

The children looked at photographs of different volcanoes and talked about their different shapes. We then made salt dough volcanoes and watched the reaction when we mixed bicarbonate of soda with vinegar and red food colouring. The children were so excited to watch their volcanoes erupting!

From the off, the children were thrown into the mindset of shipbuilders, as they made pirate ships out of everyday materials strong enough to carry 'cannonballs' across a makeshift ocean. One St Petroc's team impressed so much that they ended the day being awarded with commendations for their vessel, 'The Jolly Roger'.

Later on in the morning, the children experienced tools and processes used in metal work and carpentry to make personalised Princess Ferry coasters. They were wholly enthused by the activity and have come away itching to begin applying their new found skills to the next workshop and phase of the school's boat making task.













#### **Outdoor Learning**


#### New for this academic year!

Key Stage 2 will now be making the most of our new and improved outdoor spaces every Wednesday afternoon, by having their lessons outdoors - whatever the weather!

This week, we introduced the pupils to the awesome new outdoor learning haven, and started by cooking damper bread on an open fire. Three groups rotated around:

Ms Croxall took the groups stick hunting for the cooking of the bread and future kindling; Mrs Rees had the important role of overseeing the dough being made; and Mr Fox talked about fire safety and introduced the pupils to a flint and steel.





#### **Optional:**

Children are allowed to bring in a change of 'outdoor' clothes for these Wednesday afternoon sessions. This will avoid their uniform potentially getting muddy or smelly of wood smoke.







We came together at the end for the cooking of the bread and a discussion about how fire has shaped the world we live in - "What would our lives be like without fire?".

In the coming weeks and seasons, we hope to use this outdoor time to develop the area further, with planting and composting. It'll be an area for learning new skills and conducting Science inquiries. We'll also be using the area for Maths and English lessons.
